

There were no additional nominees.

The chair then asked for motion to declare them elected by acclamation. A poll was taken and the nominated persons were elected.

Elections

Resolutions Placed Before Convention

Resolution: (NY-A) Diocesan Budget for 2021

Wende Palmer, Diocesan Treasurer moved the budget and spoke to it.

Discussion followed. Ellen Brauza asked about the full share asking is going down. Maria indicated the lower amount is based on reported income.

The chair then asked for a poll and the budget was approved

Resolution: (NY-B) Amendments to Canons

Earle King, Chair of the Constitutions and Canon's Committee presented the proposed amendments..

These simply refer to punctuations and grammar. Each must be voted upon by orders.

There was a single poll, but separate sections for clergy and lay on each measure. There were separate sections; every voter had to vote in both sections. One section was for clergy yes or no (or to designate

you were lay); the other section was yes or no (or to designate you were clergy). It was unanimous in

both orders.

Resolution: (NY-C) Amendments to Canon 9.2

Earle King indicated the initial population of the Council was no longer needed and should be stricken.

The poll requires 2/3 in each order. The poll passed in both orders.

Resolution: (NY-D) Discipline of a Priest or Deacon

Earle King moved this and spoke to it. This is a result of a meeting of chancellors to form a regional

disciplinary board.

The remaining part of the canon is kept in place so that if the regional disciplinary board is eliminated, we

still have a structure in place without a further amendment.

The initial composition was no longer necessary and is eliminated.

The new arrangements become effective in January 2021.

A poll was taken and passed by more than 2/3 vote in both orders.

Nominations to the Disciplinary Committee

Nominated were Hon Rose Sconiers, The Rev. Alison Martin, The Very Rev. Colleen O-Connor.

Rose Sconiers was elected by acclimation. A poll was taken with respect to the clergy.

The clergy are for unexpired term, and a poll later determined which clergy gets the longer term. The

Very Rev. Colleen O'Connor received the longer term.
